



the context in which local governance operates with the aim to reach economic and social development.




EVALUATION OF "CYCLE 6" ACTIVITIES IN LIBYA

- Training should be more tailored to Libyan context, Libyan local laws, regulations
- Decision regulating contracts and government purchases should be addressed

The average improvement rate in the skills of participants in the 10 partner municipalities was **83**%, meaning that the level of knowledge and skills of the trainees in the Cycle's topics improved by 83% compared to their level before the course, which represents a noticeable improvement.

CYCLE 7 - WASTE MANAGEMENT

Online, October 2024

Effective waste management has become imperative for sustainable development and environmental protection. Municipalities play a crucial role in managing waste efficiently to protect public health and environment.

Training session (October 21, 2024)

16 participants + 3 PO

The live session covered the basic principles of waste management, treatment and recycling, and discussed the reality and challenges of waste management in Libyan municipalities.

The training targeted Municipalities' staff, with particular focus on decision-makers: general secretary, heads of departments and technicians in charge of waste management at the local level.





Mentoring session (October 28, 2024)

The session contained three main sections:

- 1. Presentation on "Composting" given by Peter Szerb (Ciedel)
- 2. Presentation on "Waste to Value Project" by Wafa Attawil (CCI)
- 3. Intervention by participants about their experiences on waste management in their municipalities

Online, December 2024 - January 2025


This is the last training module of the whole REBUILD curriculum. It provides municipalities staff with guidance and resources to improve water management at the local level. The topic of this module is related to the REBUILD pilot project on Environmental safety and drinking water quality.


Training session (December 23, 2024)

13 participants

The live session covered the basic principles of water management, the challenges of the Sustainable Development Goals regarding access to clean water, the Legislative Framework for municipalities in Libya on water management and the necessary steps for implementing a service within a municipality.

The training targeted Municipalities' staff, with particular focus on decision-makers: general secretary, heads of departments and technicians in charge of water management at the local level.





Mentoring session (January 14, 2025)

The session was attended by the water and environmental sanitation officials in the partner municipalities. The training was carried out by Dr. Iman Al-Harsha, an expert in the field of water management, and Mr. Peter Zerb, the trainer from the Ciedel Center. The session contained 2 main parts:

- 1. Presentation on various water management strategies and the Water Safety Plan
- 2. Presentation of cases and challenges faced by municipalities in sewage networks and drinking water systems

- Preferable to provide more expertise on the Libvan context

Main findings

- All participants were very happy with the training either excellent or very good
- Both the trainer and training topics were described as very good

 The trainer received special praise from different participants due to her ability to simplify and summarize training materials

Recommendations

- More time for training and higher number of training sessions, in order to expand on fundamental topics and having time for discussion and interaction
- Better in-presence sessions, especially considering the poor internet connection in specific parts of the country which disabled several people from attending the first session
